Standards of Membership

Standards of membership in the Senatobia High School chapter of National Senior Beta must conform to the general features as laid down in the national constitution, and in all cases must be approved by the executive head of the high school.

The grades from which members may be drawn shall be 9-12.

The scholastic requirements for membership in this chapter of National Senior Beta shall be a cumulative grade point average not below 90.

Loss of Membership

A member of this chapter of this chapter of National Senior Beta may be dropped from membership if he/she is absent without a justifiable reason from four (4) regular consecutive meetings.

A member of this chapter of National Senior Beta may be dropped from membership if his/her scholastic record falls below a cumulative average of 90.

A member of this chapter of National Senior Beta may be dropped from membership if he/she commits any Level 3, 4, or 5 offense **or** two (2) Level 2 offenses as determined by the Senatobia Municipal School District Code of Conduct.

Officers

The officers of this chapter of National Senior Beta shall be President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

The duties of the President shall be to preside at the meetings; to appoint the committees of the chapter (unless otherwise provided for in the by-laws); to represent this organization when necessary; and to administer the policies as laid down in this constitution and its by-laws.

The duties of the Vice-President shall be to preside at meetings when the president is absent or incapacitated to perform the duties of the office, and to assist in administering the affairs of the chapter – serving on such committees as are designated in the by-laws.

5. No more than TWO discipline referrals for the previous semester.
6. No previous OLC placements 7th -12th grade.

1. Must have attended SHS for one full year prior to election
2. Must have a cumulative "B" average in grades 9-12
3. Must currently be actively involved in at least 2 extra-curricular activities
4. No more than one suspension of any kind during the current school year.
5. No previous OLC placements 7th -12th grade.

Hall of Fame

Hall of Fame Selection

- I. Purpose
 - a) To recognize works of distinction by outstanding seniors.
 - b) To encourage other students to emulate the high ideals and characteristics which a member of the Hall of Fame possesses.

- II. Committee for Selection:
 - a) Faculty committee composed of the counselor and three other faculty members
 - b) Hall of Fame will be chosen by using a point system. This system is based on academics and extracurricular participation.
 - c) All the proceedings are to be kept confidential with Hall of Fame selections announced at High School Awards night.

- III. Qualifications of Nominees:
 - a) All nominees must have attended Senatobia High School for three semesters prior to selection.
 - b) The number of Hall of Fame members is dependent on the size of the class, as well as the number of outstanding seniors. The number of Hall of Fame members will be no more than 10% of the graduating class.
 - c) Candidates should possess the following characteristics and qualities:
 - No out-of-school suspensions grades 9 – 12
 - Have at least a “B” average with no failing grades
 - Candidates should be active or have been active in at least two (2) extra-curricular in their junior and senior years.
 - No student shall be considered for Hall of Fame unless he/she has received points from two separate activities.

Point System for Hall of Fame:

3 points for every point over 85 average for seven semesters (up to end of 1st semester of senior year)

2 points for band membership – each year 9-12

- 1 point for each special position, such as guard or officer (maximum of 5 points)

2 points for each sport participation – per year 9-12

- 1 point for all conference

1 point for participation with Special Olympics

2 points for cheerleading position – per year 9-12

- 1 point for captain
- 1 point for club membership (per year)
- 1 point for class officer, student council, and/or club officer
 - 2 points for Beta Club/National Honor Society
- 1 point for publication staff member at end of the year (yearbook or newspaper)
- 2 points for assistant editors, photographer, or editor of yearbook or newspaper
- 3 points for perfect SATP score
- 3 points for 30 or above on the ACT
- 2 points for 25 – 29 on the ACT
- 1 point for 20 – 24 on the ACT
- 3 points for STAR student
- 3 points for Valedictorian
- 2 points for Salutatorian
- 2 points for Highest Honor Graduate
- 1 point for Honor Graduate
- 1 point for All A's (entire year)
- 2 points for Leadership Conferences
- 1 point for Perfect Attendance – per year 9-12
